He is former Professor in Organisational Behaviour and Human Resource Management of IIM, Indore & Lucknow. A Ph.D. & D.Litt. in OB, D.Sc. in Management Science, he is a Fellow of AIMA. He was instrumental in setting up Bhubaneswar Chapter of NHRDN and was its first President in 2004.

He received International Teaching Excellence Award, 2016 by ACBSP, USA, as one among the top ten management educators of the world, and only one from India.

He is appointed by the Hon'ble President of India as a member of the Courts of Central University of Rajasthan and Guru Ghasidas Central University. He has been an elected member to Council of Management of AIMA.
